# FACILIITES UPDATE

We hope you have seen the improvements that were made last year including replacement of all docking, replacement of the swim platform, new swim raft, removal of overgrown trees in the beach area, installation of a new fire pit, and mulching of the playground area.

This year we will be re-siding the clubhouse, modernizing the bathrooms, installing additional outside clubhouse lighting, replacing the steps leading to the beach, installing an outside shower platform, painting the pavilion, installing a ceiling fan, and purchasing new Adirondack chairs for the beach. The Clubhouse siding and bathroom work is scheduled to be completed before we open the beach for the summer.

We are contracting a local builder to complete Clubhouse projects but will be replacing the steps, installing shower platform, and painting bathroom and pavilion floors ourselves. ### **BOAT REGISTRATION**

All boats stored on the beach boat racks must be registered with The Seneca Lake Club and require an annual \$20.00 fee per boat. Boats not registered by June 1, 2019 will be removed at the owner's expense.

#### AED DEVICE

For the added safety of beachgoers we have purchased an AED device which will be located in the clubhouse garage which also has a phone to be used for emergency situations

### WATER MANAGEMENT

Our greatest asset is our lake and we work very hard at keeping it clean so that we can maximize its use for both fishing and swimming.

You may not be aware but we are required to take water tests each week that the lake is open to swimming and submit those to the county health department for their testing. If we were to fail those tests, our beach would be closed to swimming.

One of the greatest threats to water quality is goose feces. Throughout the year we manage our geese population and try to limit (or eliminate) as much as possible goose fecal matter from entering the lake which can quickly cause our water quality to reach unsafe levels. Our goose management program includes addling eggs in the spring, installing goose deterrent lights, installing goose deterrent roping on the beach front, and goose harassment through the use of noise. We do all this as humanly as possible and follow Fish and Wildlife guidelines

Weeds also impact the quality of our water and we invest significant dollars each year in controlling weed growth using a third party vendor. We've been very successful in keeping the weeds to a minimum over the years and will continue that program in 2019.

# AUTOMATION OF MEMBERSHIP DUES

We are pleased to have Christine Molbury join the board and take on the treasurer responsibilities. Christine has made several recommendations to help streamline our membership processes which will include electronic dues statements and payments. Look for more in the coming months on that and other ways we are trying to accommodate our membership while reducing the time and cost of manually performing those tasks.

#### DAM MANAGEMENT

Our Dam requires ongoing maintenance and a bi-annual inspection done by the NJ division of dam safety and flood control. This past December we received a satisfactory grade. You can find the full inspection report along with documents on our emergency evacuation, and our operations and maintenance document on our website.

#### FISHING AND WATERCRAFT/BOATING RULES

A reminder of the rules for fishing and boating at Seneca Lake

#### **Fishing**

- Seneca Lake is a catch and release lake. All fish caught must be released back into the lake and unharmed
- Fishing is prohibited within the roped off areas of the beach
- Ice Fishing is prohibited at all times

#### Boats/Watercraft

- Gas powered watercraft/boats are prohibited
- All watercraft/boats must be registered and marked for identification
- Watercraft/Boats are to be launched only from the left side of the dock
- Watercraft/boats may not be docked on the beach
- Personal floatation devices are required for each boater
