A reminder of the rules for fishing and boating at Seneca Lake

Fishing

- Seneca Lake is a catch and release lake. All fish caught must be released back into the lake and unharmed
- Fishing is prohibited within the roped off areas
- Ice Fishing is always prohibited

Boats/Watercraft

- Gas powered watercraft/boats are prohibited
- All watercraft/boats must be registered
- Watercraft/boats are to be launched from the left side of the dock
- Watercraft/boats may not be docked on the beach
- Personal floatation devices are required for each boater

Register your boat

All boats stored on the beach boat racks must be registered with The Seneca Lake Club and require an annual \$20.00 fee per boat.

Boat decals will be provided to those registered and must be placed on the side of the boat facing the beach so that we can easily identify

The swimming season is fast approaching, and water tests are conducted weekly to ensure that our water is clean and safe to swim in.

Over the last several years Seneca Lake has had the cleanest water in Sussex County and wants to stay that way.

Lake Front homes should deter Goose inhabitants as an Adult Geese poops 2lbs per Goose per day and this eventually washes into the Lake and raises bacteria counts. Please grow your grass high on the waterfront- install barriers (Strings and Fences) and deter Geese from making your lawn a meal and poop sanctuary.

Chasing Geese off your property (approach banging a pot or clapping your hands) is also helpful as they are inherently lazy and will go to a Lake or Pond where they are not bothered - which is a winwin for both the Geese and Seneca Lake.

My younger son, Michael, and Katie, his wife, live in Glen Ridge with their three children:


- Emily HS Sophomore

Seneca Lake Club Rules

- Seneca Lake Club identification cards must be on display while on club property.
- Club property is closed from 10pm until sunrise except where it is officially authorized.
- No one under the age of 16 is allowed on the beach without a parent/guardian present.
- Overnight parking is prohibited unless approved by the board.
- No mopeds, power driven recreation vehicles or motor vehicles are to be operated on the land or water of Club property unless for emergency operations or Club purposes
- No ball playing on the beach area when bathers are present.
- No bike riding on beach or grassy areas.
- In the event that a minor is causing damage or creating a nuisance on Club property, an Active Member is authorized to order him/her to vacate the premises and not to return without a parent/guardian.
- Glass containers or apparatuses of any kind are prohibited except in food and drink areas.
- Pick up all trash in your area and place it in the appropriate receptacle.
- Abide by all local, State or federal epidemic guidelines regarding social distancing, personal hygiene, etc.
- No one is permitted on the concrete spillway or in the stream except for authorized maintenance or repair activities.
- Use of the pavilion for parties is by reservation only.

Swimming and Bathing

- No Life Guard on Duty. Swimming is at your own risk.
- Do not enter the water if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had any signs or symptoms of a gastrointestinal (stomach) disease in the past seven days.
- Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others shall be prohibited.
- No swimming beyond the floating dock or outside of the buoys.
- No diving anywhere including from the floating dock.
- Outdoor bathing shall be prohibited during an electrical storm and all guests should seek shelter.
- Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be prohibited from entering the water.
- Nude sunbathing or swimming is prohibited
- Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the water. Immediately report any "accidents" you observe in the bathing waters to the beach supervisor or board member.
- All children in diapers must wear diapers specially designed for immersion in water (such as swimming diapers). Do not wash out soiled diapers in the bathing water.
- No animals, except for service animals, shall be allowed in the on lake property or in the water
- Water toys and flotation devices are allowed. Check the intended age, weight ranges and use of water toys and flotation devices to ensure safe use. Substitutes such as water wings, swim rings, inflatable toys and other items designed for water recreation cannot replace responsible adult supervision.

There is a fully equipped First Aid box and AED device in the clubhouse garage, marked by the first aid signage

There is also a cell phone by the first aid box and is to be used for emergency situations

It is a County Health Department mandate that the clubhouse garage door is opened when you are on the beach. Opening the garage door is done using the key found in the lock box which can be opened using the SLC Code. If you do not have the code, please email senecalakeclub@gmail.com.

If you are the last person on the beach when leaving, please close and lock the garage door
